


Folktales among Shi'i tribes in the south, Collected in 1940s









Urban planning from the 50s to 70s

- 1954 Completion of a water control system in Tharthar Lake
- 1955 Demolish slums in Rusafa and Karkh (master plan initiated by the British)
- 1958 master plan by the Greek Doxiadis Company

=> Thawra Town (under PM Qassem [1958-63])

- 1969-73 Housing construction project, led by UN mission
- 1969, 1974 Master plan by Polservice (Poland)
- 1976-80 Housing Planning led by German consultants
- ⇒Saddam City (Saddam Hussein, 1979-2003)
- \Rightarrow Al-Sadr City (2003-)
